If your child is going to be absent, please notify the Bowen Office (616)455-5220 as soon as possible.


# Spotlight on our Specials Team

#### PE

PE with Mrs. Hibma: In the new year, students in Grades 3–5 will continue learning about basketball, and start a unit of study on volleyball. Mrs. Hibma will lead a volleyball clinic for students in Grades 2–5 (see flyer). Students in Young 5s – Grade 2 will continue to build their locomotor skills, cooperative play with dribbling, throwing and striking.

### Music

Music with Mrs. Bendert:

- Kindergarteners will continue to explore percussion instruments, find their singing voices, and move safely in self space to different styles of music.
- First Graders will work on performing patterns alone and as a class with their voices and on instruments, match pitch, and learn whole-class dances.
- Second Graders will perform repeated patterns on instruments in songs, sing with solfege, and learn partner-change dances.
- Third Graders will explore basslines on pitched percussion instruments, sing with solfege, improvise tonal patterns, and traditional folk dances
- Fourth Graders will learn more notes on the recorder, sing in rounds, and learn reels and folk dances.
- Fifth Graders will explore more chords on the Ukulele; singing and playing at the same time. They will also learn reels and folk dances.

## Library

Library with Mrs. Gombert: Mrs. Gombert added more books to the Library in the month of December. We had several students submit a guess for the number of books used to create the Holiday Book Tree. The closest guess was 732, submitted by a 4th grader. The tree was created using 731 books! We'll start January with books about resolutions and Asian New Year.
